

Blended combined First aid at Work and Paediatric First Aid

This 2-part course is ideal for people who work and deal with first aid for children as well as with first aid at work incidents for adults and enables them to be a workplace First-Aider under the Health and Safety (First Aid) regulations 1981, and a Paediatric First Aider under the requirements of The Early Years Foundation Stage.

Part 1: Learners complete an interactive e-learning module, at their own pace. It will take approximately 6 hours to complete. At the end of the module, learners do a multiple-choice assessment.

Part 2: A two-day interactive face to face session during which learners will be assessed on their practical first aid skills.

Topics covered include:

The Role of the Paediatric/First Aider	CPR and AED use for babies, children and adults
Incident and Casualty Assessment	Choking for babies, children and adults
Dealing with an Unconscious Casualty	Anaphylaxis and use of adrenaline auto-injectors
Asthma	Shock
Minor Injuries	External Bleeding
Eyes, Ears and Nose injuries	Burns

Hypoxia	Hyperventilation
Chest Injuries	Heart Problems and Stroke
Fractures, Dislocations, Sprains and Strains	Epilepsy and Seizures (inc febrile convulsions)
Diabetes	Meningitis
Poisonous Substances	Electric Shock
Body Temperature	Head and Spinal Injuries

Duration: Approximately 6-8 hours
